The feedback we have received highlights a significant need to listen to these voices and comprehend transgenerational legacies in Germany, the Netherlands, France, and other parts of Europe.

We are delighted to announce the release of our inaugural eBook, featuring a comprehensive interview with a German witness: the narrative of Gerhard, which laid the foundation for the university thesis on the Kriegsenkel.

- This profoundly human narrative delves into his childhood in Berlin, familial secrets, the insidious pedagogy bequeathed by Nazism, intergenerational conflicts, and the pursuit of inner reconciliation.

The French version is now available, and the German edition is currently being finalized.


invitations for additional presentations,

Ongoing projects and projections for 2026

Europe Days 2026: a bold initiative



We are presently developing a proposal for a European event scheduled for May 2026.

We aim to organize a public conference in Angers that will bring together family legacies that are seldom united.

- descendants of the victims,
- descendants of German military personnel
- heirs involved in a personal research endeavor,
- representatives of German families who opposed Nazism
- and an academic specialist

This project seeks to position Angers and our association at the forefront of European memory transmission.



Project advancement on the Shared Memory initiative.

The project is advancing along three avenues:

Translation and proofreading of various publications in German, derived from interviews.

Simultaneous release in French and German.

Developing new publications derived from narratives provided by members of partner associations.

In-depth meetings with our German partners are scheduled to take place in Angers this autumn to facilitate the organization of this collaborative effort.


Educational emphasis: a pivotal advancement

The development of educational booklets for colleges, high schools, university students, and nursing homes is progressing.

We requested the DSDEN to conduct an initial assessment within a school environment: a crucial step to evaluate the pertinence of our materials and to provide them to educators interested in addressing these subjects in the classroom.

We are initiating an appeal to:

teachers, librarians, cultural mediators, seeking to explore educational publications or booklets.



Neither rewriting history nor turning the page.



"The past requires examination."

Following our conferences, two categories of reactions consistently emerge. Some scholars, both German and French, are pondering: "Aren't you attempting to alter history?" they inquire. Their reserve is not emotional; it arises from a rigorous scientific perspective, grounded in established facts rather than familial narratives.

Other reactions, particularly in Germany, arise from a well-documented social reflex: "Let us turn the page." This phrase often serves as a means to circumvent the reopening of still-sensitive familial wounds.

These two perspectives originate from distinctly different realms, yet they culminate in the same misconception.

Our responsibility is not to rewrite history or to evoke guilt, but to provide a space for what families continue to bear in silence, often for multiple generations.
